## 11th Lecture series

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> of October, 2019 the school organized the 11<sup>th</sup> edition of its lecture series featuring Justice Dhananjaya Yeshwant Chandrachud – an eminent judge of the Supreme Court of India. Over the course of an hour, Justice Chandrachud touched upon various subjects relating to the field of law including, but not limited to, the relevance and framework of the Constitution, rule of law as distinct from rule by the law, his daily routine as a judge, processes of the court etc. More significantly, he inspiringly spoke to the students about concepts of ‘right’ and ‘wrong’ astutely stating that there is seldom a dispute between right and wrong, rather, the conflict arises between “what is right and what is right.” He talked about the harmful repercussions arising from our blind pursuit of success, and eloquently argued the necessity of reflection and humanism.

His lecture was followed by an interactive session wherein the students raised profound questions on a spectrum of subjects ranging from the role of media and technology in the functioning of the courts, lengthy litigation, the feasibility of regional Supreme Court benches, etc.
