To develop a passion for reading, here are some tips to help you along the way:

- Take time out to read regularly with your child. Have your child read aloud to you. Some nights you can read back to them as well. By doing this, not only will your child learn the correct pronunciation and voice modulation but also develop his /her listening skills.
- Allow your child to choose books of his / her liking – once they start to enjoy reading they can be gently guided and motivated to include other books in their reading lists.
- We have “Book Corners” in class where children go and pick up books whenever they are free. A similar corner can be created in your child’s bed room.
- D.E.A.R (Drop Everything And Read), activity is a regular feature in our school and is conducted across all classes. This can happen at home too, when all family members read together.

Kindly contribute age appropriate books for the class library. Besides fostering a love for books in the child, to exchange books also inculcates the value of sharing in the child !

A number of activities are planned for the week as mentioned below:


- Nursery** - Story Enactment by Teachers (Monkey and Cap seller)
