



Important instructions for Grade 9trip

3. It is mandatory to carry your **School ID card.**
4. **Dress code** should be strictly followed by all throughout the two days.
Girls can wear traditional or western wear which includes Salwar kameez /Jeans/ Full pants or long skirts with either long or half sleeved top.
NOTE: See-through fabrics, halter tops, off-the-shoulder or low-cut tops, shorts, spaghetti straps, shirts with inappropriate messages are **NOT** allowed.
Boys can wear Jeans/ Full pants with either long or half sleeved T-shirt.
This will ensure that you represent yourself and your school well.
Do carry one thick jacket and some warm clothes along with thermals and socks.
Students need to **carry their school jackets** and wear them when going out for sightseeing.
5. We expect and will accept only excellent behavior from all students throughout the trip.
6. Students must realize that traveling in a large group is different from traveling with your family. Decisions are made and instructions are given with the safety and concern of the entire group in mind and not based upon the wishes and desires of any individual.
7. Carry one normal sized **bag** and one carry-on bag. Bags will be stowed beneath the bus; therefore, **STUDENTS WILL NOT HAVE ACCESS TO THEM.** Anything needed during the bus journey should be packed in the carry-on bag.
8. In case of any **medical issues**, inform Minakshi ma'am beforehand.
9. **Students are solely responsible for ALL of their belongings** whether money, camera, Ipods, earphones etc. Carry at your own risk.
10. Carry a water bottle, umbrella, torch, basic medicines, toiletries, comfortable shoes, slippers, warm pullover or a jacket.
11. **The hotel phones are not** to be used for any reason.
12. **Mobile phones/Smart Watches/ Laptop/ Ipads etc. are NOT** allowed. In case of any need to call parents, contact Minakshi ma'am.
13. Being in the **possession of or consumption of alcohol** or any other behavior altering substances in any form will be considered a serious violation of the rules and immediate action will follow.
14. Students are to remain with the group at all times.

Mussoorie



Mussoorie, also known as the Queen of Hills is a famous hill station in Uttarakhand. It is about 35 kilometers from the state capital of Dehradun and 290 km north of the national capital of New Delhi. The hill station is in the foothills of the Garhwal Himalayan range. Established in the early seventeenth century, Mussoorie saw a large number of schools and prestigious institutions with famous and old hotels becoming a landmark.
